Special City Council Joint Meeting

**Welcome, Introductions, Confirm Agenda**

The LFP meeting was called to order by Mayor Johnson at 5:50. Attended by Mayor Johnson, Deputy Mayor Stanford, Councilmember French, Councilmember Phillips, Councilmember Wright, Public Works Director Zenk and City Administrator Rose.

**Lynnwood Link Extension and ST3 –**

- ST3 25 Year Plan
- Shoreline 145th Street Multi-Modal Corridor Preferred Concept
- SR 522/SR 523 Corridor - Opportunities for Partnership

Shoreline staff presented background information on these three projects. The main LFP comments were for us all to continue to work together in the cities coalition that has resulted in good regional advocacy for ST3; and to pay attention to the 145<sup>th</sup> Street/Bothell Way intersection as a critical blockage in the flow of the SR 522/523 corridor.

**Entity Updates**

- City of Lake Forest Park
  - Safe Streets and Healthy Creeks
  - Safe Routes to Schools Grant – Briarcrest Elementary
  - Corridor Study of SR 104 – through LFP
  - LFP Park & Recreation Service Level Study

Mayor Johnson and Deputy Mayor Stanford gave overviews to these items, except the Safe Routes entry, which was not discussed. Director Zenk and Administrator Rose added details. The main point was to note that there is much in common with interconnecting streets, watersheds and neighborhoods.

- City of Shoreline
  - Parks, Recreation and Open Space Master Plan Update
  - Maintenance & Operations – Levy Lid Lift Renewal
  - 145th Station Subarea Plan Timeline

Shoreline staff presented background information on these Shoreline initiatives. The main discussion was in finding common ground in the needs and efforts of both cities to have a healthy parks and recreation system; and to have discussion of the impacts of light rail on each community, especially noting concern for pass-through traffic. The conclusions were to be mindful of how our efforts need to result in getting a good portion of the population into the mass transit system and how the two cities need to work on

Elected officials from each city spoke to the value of meeting and working together and suggested that it be done more often.


### **Adjourn**
