CONTINUING THE TRACK RECORD OF SUCCESS

- In 2021, we made progress in advancing the City's legislative priorities:
 - \$1.2 million for the Lakefront Property Acquisition
 - \$100,000 for Town Center to Burke Gilman Trail Connector included in both House and Senate Transportation Revenue Package proposals

2022 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

- Second year of the two-year biennium
- Short, 60-day session
- Focus on supplemental budgets
 - Operating, Capital, and Transportation
- Policy Bills
 - Legislation that did not pass in 2021 carries over 2022
 - New policy bills can be introduced
- Format?
 - Virtual? Hybrid? Unknown.

OVERVIEW OF THE 2022 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

- Democrats hold the majority in both chambers
- Committee assignments generally remain the same
- Legislative offices on the ballot in November 2022
 - Redistricting Commission is required to complete new boundaries by November 2021
 - Legislators seeking re-election will have new district boundaries

- Town Center to Burke Gilman Connector

- Regional Crisis Triage Center
